## Question: "What if I took Algebra or Geometry in middle school"?

You need a minimum of three years recorded on the transcript. If you took Algebra or Geometry in middle school, then you are probably in Math Analysis or Calculus now.

Keep going-you are doing awesome

## Question: "How do I get my Algebra or Geometry from middle school added to my transcript?"

Go see your counselor. There is a form that both you and your parents must sign.
Legally once a class is put on the transcript, we can not take it off. We recommend only adding credit earned in middle school if it is going to raise your cumulative gpa.

## Social Studies

## World History A and B

If you have been at Lindbergh all three years, then you completed your World History in the tenth-grade year.

Find it- and if you passed it- mark if off
Hint: if you were in the Kent School District in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade then you may have done your World History in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade

## US History A and B

All Juniors took US History A the first trimester of this year.

- If you passed it - mark it off.

All of you should either be in US History B now or next trimester.

- Put a dot in the US History B box indicating that you are taking it now.


## Civics and Contemporary World Problems

We take this in our Senior year
Hint: If you are a student that was in a different school district your ninth or tenth grade years then you may have already taken Civics or CWP. Different districts take these classes in different years.

## AP World History C is unique -

Did you take AP World History in your Sophomore year?
The content in the third trimester of AP World History covered the requirements for Contemporary World Problems.

If you took AP World History C and passed it, then you can also mark off the CWP box. You do not need to take CWP next year.

## PE and Health

- 1.50 credits (Three trimester classes) of Physical Education is a graduation requirement.
- Health - a .50 credit of Health is required.

You can find this in your ninth-grade year.

Hint: If you were in a different district in ninth and tenth grade then you may not have taken Health yet. If you can not find Health on your transcript, then you are going to need to take it next year as a senior. It is a requirement for a diploma.


- Most of you took Chemistry A and Physics A as a Freshman


## Science

A minimum of three years

Website Design, Game Design, Journalism and Yearbook will count as fine arts for meeting your high school diploma however neither class fulfills the fine art requirement for university admissions.

PPR Stands for "Personal Pathway"

You get to make a choice:
Personal Pathway or 2 credits of a World Language

## What is the PPR? PERSONALIZED PATHWAY

Personalized pathway is for students who are passionate about a field that does not require a 4 -year education, they can take 3 credits that will prepare them for a field to replace the 2 credits of World Language and 2nd credit of Fine Art.

Example 1: A student who wishes to go directly to a 4-year university would need to earn:
-2.0 credits of World Language
-1.0 additional credit of Fine Art

Example 2: A student who plans to become a graphic designer, and will attend a 2-year college to start, could take:
-1.0 credit of Visual Communications
-1.0 credit of Website Design
-1.0 credit of Introduction to Marketing

## World Language

## Two years of a World Language

## are required for admission to a 4-year university.

For University Admissions the two years must be the same language.

Competitive universities prefer three or four years of the same language.

## World Language Exam

If you can speak, read and write another language then you can earn credit.

This exam is offered once each Fall and again in the Spring.
Exams are available in over 100 different languages!


## Electives - What is an "Elective"

## There is no magic list of electives

An "Elective" is simply classes that you take in addition to the basic requirements.

Your elective choices should prepare you for: "What are you graduating to?"

- Two-year Community Colleges
- Four-year Colleges and Universities
- Career/Technical Trade Schools
- Apprenticeship
- Military
- Employment
- Courses that don't necessarily apply to any of the above, but look like something you'd like to try (you never know where it might lead!)


## If you are planning to apply directly to a four-year university then your electives are going to be:

## Civics and Contemporary World Problems

- Almost all of you still need to take these.

A few exceptions:
Social Studies- Civics and Contemporary World Issues are required for a diploma Most students take these their Senior Year. *Civics - 1 TriContemporary World Problems - 1 Tri

- If you took AP World History as a Sophomore.
> AP World History C covers similar content as CWP.
> If you took AP World History C and passed it, then you can put another course in the CWP spot.
- You already took and passed Civics or CWP at a different high school

Sometimes other school districts have their students take Civics or CWP in younger grades.
If you were in another school district in ninth or tenth grade and your transcript shows that you have already taken and passed one of these then you do not need to take it again.

## Math - it is important

Even if you have already completed your three years of Math

- it is extremely wise to continue to take Math your Senior year.
- University: A senior year of math is required for direct admission.
- Community College: You want to be able to test into college level math. Tuition is expensive. Learn your math here for free.
- Technical College/Apprenticeships: Math skills are required for most trades.
- Military: As part of the recruiting process to join the military they will have you take a placement exam called the ASVAB. How you do on the ASVAB is used to determine the job that the military will train you to do. You want them to think you are smart so that you are trained for a good job.
